I write in connection with your request for information dated 09/05/2026, received by Greater Manchester Police (GMP) for the following information:

Please provide the following information for the calendar year 2025, from 1 January 2025 to 31 December 2025.

If full-year 2025 data is not yet available, please provide the latest available 2025 data and state the date range covered.

For sexual offences where an individual was charged, summonsed, postal requisitioned, or otherwise proceeded against, please provide:

- 1. The total number of cases/offences/proceedings recorded.*
- 2. A breakdown by nationality as recorded by the force.*
- 3. A summary breakdown showing:*
 - a. British national;*
 - b. foreign national;*
 - c. unknown / not recorded / refused.*
- 4. Where held, a breakdown by detailed offence type or Home Office offence classification.*
- 5. A short explanation of the counting basis used, for example whether the figures count individuals, arrests, offences, custody records, charges, proceedings, or another category.*

Where any nationality has fewer than 5 results, please suppress the exact figure and mark it as "<5".

For clarity, I am requesting aggregate statistical data only. I am not requesting names, addresses, dates of birth, victim information, case summaries, or free-text crime reports.

Result of Searches

Following receipt of your request searches were conducted within Greater Manchester Police to locate information relevant to your request. I can confirm that the information you have requested is held by Greater Manchester Police.

Any count value less than 5 has been marked as '< 5' has been exempted from disclosure under Section 40(2) Personal Information – this information constitutes personal data of an identifiable living individual, and to disclose this information would breach the principles of the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) and the Data Protection Act 2018. Personal data is defined by Section 1 of the Data Protection Act 1998 and means data that relates to an individual who can be identified directly or indirectly from that data.

Caveats

In July 2019, GMP implemented one of the largest IT infrastructure changes in UK policing. The systems are in continual development and the data provided for this request is what the systems currently hold.

1. The following data was obtained by filtering the Crime Tree Level Four to 'Rape', and 'Other Sexual Offences' with a reported date between 1st January 2025 and 31st December 2025. It was then further filtered to only contain the below Latest Outcome Categories:
 - A Community Resolution (with or without formal restorative justice) (Formal Police Diversion Scheme) (8D)
 - A Community Resolution (with or without formal restorative justice) (Informal Police Action) (8C)
 - Adult Caution (3A)
 - Adult Caution Alternative Offence (3C)
 - Adult Conditional Caution (3B)
 - Adult Conditional Caution Alternative Offence (3D)
 - Charge (1A)
 - Charged Alternative Offence (1C)
 - Decision Pending (98)
 - Locate Trace (15E)
 - Offender Has Died (5)
 - Outcome 20 - Referred to Other Agency (96)

- Refer To Pnc (15D)
 - Summons (1B)
 - Youth Caution (2A)
 - Youth Conditional Caution (2B)
 - Youth Conditional Caution Alternative Offence (2D)

2. The counting basis used is number of offenders, however this will contain some duplicate values. This is because this data includes Multi Victim and Multi Offender Crimes, so the same offender may be counted multiple times if they have committed more than one crime, and the same crime may be counted multiple times if there was more than one offender involved. On this basis, for this dataset the number of offenders = number of offences.
 3. The data is based on the date the crime was recorded, not the date the crime was committed.
 4. Please note this data is subject to change as crimes are progressed and/or updated.
 5. Please note that the requested category of 'British National' had to be amended to 'Nationality - United Kingdom'. This is because of the way some Nationalities were recorded, I was unable to separate the data from 'United Kingdom' into just British countries that are a part of the UK.

You have the right to require Greater Manchester Police to review their decision.

Prior to lodging a formal complaint you are welcome and encouraged to discuss the decision with the case officer that dealt with your request.

Complaint
